The American Museum of Natural History and Barnard College Teaching Experiences for Undergraduates (TEU) program is a seven-week immersive summer experience in secondary science and mathematics education in New York City, funded by the Carnegie Corporation of New York.

TEU participants earn a generous stipend, take a course in either science or mathematics pedagogy, and apply what they learn to teach New York City public school students under the supervision of a master teacher-mentor.
